- Almost a 2 year process
- concept note
- full proposal
- 30 page response
- 10 page response
- Interview/presentation in DC (8 person team; ~5 hours)



Collaboration was key!

- Dean's office team (3)
- Central sponsored projects (proposal manager and GCO; AVP)
- external consultants (3); strategy; proposal management (later stages); presentation coach
- 3 national labs, 8 universities
- 90 industry and community partners



Expertise AND Communication

- Demonstration of teamwork and commitment (while balancing "normal" responsibilities)
- Working through conflict and focussing on positives
- Idea for future: someone on point for check in's / boundaries



Result was a win




Hubble Space Telescope



ZRADCancer Evolution Center

Comparative Oncology: Curated world's largest dataset on cancer across d evidence that growth rate, litter size, basal metabolic rate, ay all contribute to cancer risk.


WHY DON'T WE TALK ABOUT CANCER?

Normal somatic evolution: Discovered # stem cells in small and large intestinal crypts. Answered our central question: They aren't significantly different. Collected 58 cell lines (44 species) for functional profiling.

Neoplastic cell evolution: Translated digital pathology to colon. Found CNV diversity is not predictive, but measures of ecology are.

Developing an NIH U54 Center

A 3-year process starting in 2015

- 3 submissions
- 9 subcontracts (3 in Europe)
- No longer needs to be local: Zoom, Slack, Google Drive
- 48 pages of science (546 pages total)
- \$8M in directs over 5 years
- (Fiscal management is an issue: a weak link problem)


