

Research Development

Four Main elements

1. Strategic Research Advancement

- a. Support Grant Writing
- b. Serves as a representatives to the institution, community, and external partnerships
- c. Create strategic events for faculty members and RA

1. Communication of Research and Research Opportunities

- Manage marketing of research and proposal development tools
- b. Funding searches and consultations for individualized research
- c. Dissemination

1. Enhancement of Collaboration and Team Science

- a. Providing events for shared interest in Research
- b. Facilitate collaborations
- Maintain Database

1. Proposal Development

- a. Help to improve grant writing skills
- b. Provide strategic consultation on making proposals competitive
- c. Editing proposals

Pre-Award

The pre-award represents the beginning of the life cycle of a sponsored project. This includes but not limited to:

- Reviewing and submitting proposals
- Budget creation
- Award negotiations and acceptance
- Compliance considerations







Post-Award

Post-Award represents the middle to end of the life cycle of a sponsored project. These tasks include but are not limited to:

- Award/Account set-up
 - Meet with Pre-Award Team to discuss award
- Modifications
- Monitoring, reporting, and billing
- Forecasting
- Project closure







Risk Management

This happens in all stages of the life cycle of a sponsored project. This includes, but is not limited to:

- Auditing purposes
- Compliance
- Risk determination
- Staying up-to-date on State, Federal, and Institutional policies and regulations

- Create a living agenda with grant numbers and vital account information

- Respond even if you don't know the answer






Understand the story


